

The Sacramento region has serious air quality and public health needs:

- We have large populations within **disadvantaged communities** who are hard-hit by the health problems that our air pollution causes.
- We are not in attainment with









State or Federal health-based air quality standards, and we will not be for a long time.

- Air quality and public health are critical to a thriving business environment that attracts and retains skilled workers.
- Sacramento's air basin has some of the highest air pollution in the entire U.S., according to the American Lung Association's 2024 State of the Air report.
- The region does not meet the cookie-cutter definition of an area impacted by air pollution our region is affected mainly by mobile source pollutants from cars, trucks, and locomotives.



Advocacy:

- In the late 90s and early 2000s, we helped require the Bay Area to conduct enhanced smog checks, as our air quality was impacted by pollution blowing in from the West.
- In 2012, we successfully advocated for a CA Air Resources Board seat for the Sacramento region, currently held by Sacramento Councilmember Eric Guerra.
- In 2018, held 53 in-person meetings with State Legislators, staff, and CARB leadership in a campaign to successfully advocate for South Sacramento as a priory community for environmental justice investment by the State.
- Annual leadership, recruiting, and staffing of the Air Quality team as part of the Sacramento Metro Chamber's Capitol-to-Capitol federal advocacy program and State Legislative Summit program.

Regional Coalition Building:

Serve as a **backbone organization** for our region's clean air advocates, agencies, and regulated industries through participation in regional working groups and coalitions.







- Several Legacy members: Sacramento Metro Chamber of Commerce, Breathe California Sacramento Region, Valley Vision, the Sacramento Association of Realtors, and Teichert;

Responsible to provide strategic direction to CAP, and to manage and oversee its activities, including:

- Appropriately pursuing CAP's purpose and objectives;
- Maintaining CAP's financial health, including by contributing and soliciting funds;
- Developing and acting upon CAP's scope of work;
- Any Member at a dues level of \$10,000/yr or greater which elects to participate on the Executive Committee.
