Talent Advancement

To become a dispatcher in the Greater Sacramento Area, one needs a high school diploma or equivalent. Candidates must undergo moderate on-the-job training, which can last from 1 to 12 months.

Professional Development

POST (Police Officer Standards Training) for dispatchers is typically an entry-level 120-hour basic training course. While an associate's degree is not mandatory, it can be an added advantage. The entry-level basic training course is expected to increase from 120 to 160 hours in the near future.
